# Message from the CEO



It brings me great pleasure to present the iThemba publication for the period January to June 2022. This has been a tumultuous period not only for the District but for the province and the country as a whole. On an international scale, the outbreak of conflict in Europe, whilst geographically far removed from iLembe, is having a negative impact on the cost of living, evidenced by rising costs of agricultural inputs and oil prices. The district is still reeling from the continued devastation of the COVID-19 pandemic and the July 2021 unrests, which have affected many businesses and resulted in job losses.

The precarious economic situation was further compounded by the floods in April 2022 that caused extreme devastation, loss of life, and the displacement of hundreds of households. The economic impact of the floods continues to be felt as some of the critical mobility routes remain either closed or not yet fully restored. The impact on the agricultural sector included the inability to access markets due to road damage, loss of crops, and life-stock. The processing of agricultural outputs was also disrupted as mills in the district and neighbouring municipalities were also affected.

The tourism sector, still recovering from restrictions on travel and gatherings, also experienced substantial reductions in trade over the easter weekend which is historically one of the busiest periods in the year. Enterprise iLembe has been working with several stakeholders to ensure that affected businesses obtain

access to government relief support and the restoration of critical infrastructure.

A number of projects and support programmes have been implemented by the entity during the first half of 2022. In the agriculture sector, the Entity has supported a number of small-scale farmers with mechanization, and farming inputs, and facilitated access to commercial markets. Various SMME development programmes continue to be facilitated, including the entity's business incubator which provides valuable support to small businesses. The first tranche of the IDC business recovery fund was disbursed to 79 informal traders. Further disbursements are being made to qualifying SMMEs following a due diligence process. In terms of tourism, the Entity continues to promote the destinations through various platforms including exhibitions which are aimed at showcasing the district to potential visitors and investors, these include Meetings Africa, World Travel Market Africa, Rand Show, and the Africa Travel Indaba.

In terms of governance, the Entity welcomed Mr. Philani Gumede as a member of its board of directors, representing the manufacturing sector. The appointment of Mr. Gumede means that the board is now fully constituted and representative of the key sectors of the district economy. A new audit committee was also appointed for a period of 3 years, this will assist the Entity in adhering to good governance practices and ensure robust internal controls.

The Entity received a positive assessment from KZN COGTA in the bi-annual functionality assessment for the period October 2021 to March 2022. During this period the overall functionality was at 77% which highlights the general organizational stability and ability to execute its economic development mandate.

The iLembe Business Confidence Index for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of 2021 was released in February 2022. This survey provides insight into the subjective individual expectations of business leaders within the District, thus providing a basis for business retention and expansion interventions. The survey and economic activity indices revealed an overall positive outlook for the district economy, which is the first positive index since the introduction of the iLembe Business Confidence Index. This underscores the resilience of the district economy and the confidence that business leaders have in iLembe as a preferred investment destination. Notwithstanding the overall positive sentiments, some areas remain a concern, these include high levels of unemployment, cumbersome regulatory environment, infrastructure provision, and other macro-economic factors.

## EXHIBITIONS





# LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

## ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT

### BUSINESS RELIEF FUND

The Industrial Development Corporation (IDC) partnered with Enterprise iLembe as a Strategic Implementing Partners (SIPs) to assist informal traders and SMMEs affected by the July 2021 unrest. The relief fund is designed to target the socio-economic challenges of businesses in townships, rural areas, and small towns directly affected. The initial phase of the fund saw 86 informal traders from across the iLembe

District receive a once-off R8000 grant at a handover ceremony held on 08 March 2022. To date, 4 SMMES from Maphumulo and Ndwedwe have also received grants towards stock replenishing, repairs, and equipment replacement. The Entity is continuing with the verification process of applicants which is being conducted in partnership with respective local municipalities.



### AGRISETA CERTIFICATE HANDOVER

AgriSETA and Enterprise iLembe in partnership with IThunga Development conducted a 12-month training programme (NQF 2) for farmers in Ndwedwe in 2019. The training focused on mixed farming systems and plant production. The AgriSETA certificate handover to eighty (80) farmers took place as part of the Let's Talk Agriculture event on 26 May 2022.



# OPERATION VULA BUSINESS MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP

Enterprise iLembe in partnership with the Department of Economic Development, Tourism & Environmental Affairs hosted a workshop for beneficiaries of the Operation Vula Fund on 29 March 2022. The session was held at the iLembe Auditorium with the aim to capacitate SMMES business and financial management.

Thank you to all stakeholders who partnered with the Entity on this initiative; Department of Agriculture, Department of Small Business Development, SEFA, SEDA, ADA, EDTEA, KZN Treasury, Elan Foundation, Mandeni PCO, Mandeni Local Municipality, KwaDukuza Local Municipality and the iLembe Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Tourism.



## ACCESS TO RELIEF FUNDING WORKSHOPS

Enterprise iLembe together with SEDA and SEFA facilitated several workshops in each of the four local municipalities to assist small businesses to access and apply for relief funding which was made available through the Department of Small Business Development. The workshops were held from 06-09 May 2022.

# LET'S TALK AGRICULTURE

## FRIMAX POTATO MARKET

On 09 March 2022, Enterprise iLembe together with relevant stakeholders held a session on the Frimax potato market led by LNN capital. The onboarding session was for local farmers interested in planting for this market for the Frimax brand. Enterprise iLembe will be assisting farmers to source funding so that they can take advantage of this market. Stakeholders who formed part of the session included the Office of the Premier (KZN OTP), the KZN Department of Agriculture (KZN DARD), LNN Capital Small Enterprise Finance Agency (SEFA), and all local municipalities.



## AGRICULTURAL WORKSHOP

Enterprise iLembe in partnership with Ndwedwe Local Municipality held its inaugural 'Let's Talk Agriculture' stakeholder engagement session on 26 May 2022. The platform provided an opportunity for various stakeholders to share information with local farmers in Ndwedwe on how agricultural opportunities can be best unlocked. These opportunities include the latest agricultural trends, marketing opportunities as well as financial support offered by the different funding institutions.



## CHILD PROTECTION WEEK

In an effort to raise awareness for the rights of children, the iLembe District Municipality in partnership with sector departments and other relevant stakeholders kicked off the Child Protection Awareness campaign in Mandeni on 03 May 2021. Even though the country observes Child Protection Week from 28 May - 03 June, iLembe has over the years dedicated the whole month of May to mobilise all sectors of society to care for and protect children. This year's Child Protection Week took place from 29 May - 04 June 2022, under the theme: "Let us all Protect Children during COVID-19 and Beyond". The program saw 26 schools in the district championed by the Gender subcommittee which is chaired by Councillor Monica Khoza. Ilembe District municipality uses this platform to engage with children from lower primary school seeking to curb the rampant substance abuse, teenager pregnancy, and bullying amongst other priority issues.



## NEW NDULINDE PROJECT INTRODUCED TO COMMUNITIES

Ilembe District Municipality and Mandeni Local Municipality introduced the new Ndulinde Water Supply Scheme Phase 4D during community meetings held in Ndulinde on 15 and 16 May 2022.

The municipality will be installing two new reservoirs next to the Ndulinde pump station with a budget of R29 million set aside and is scheduled for 12 months.

## KWADUKUZA MUNICIPALITY FACILITATES AND HOSTS A SUCCESSFUL TWO-DAY MULTI-STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES BLITZ

KwaDukuza Municipality working closely with the KZN Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs – Business Regulations Unit coordinated a multi-law enforcement agencies operation/blitz under the auspices of the quarterly KDM EDP – Development Enforcement Bylaws Enforcement Blitz Programme. The enforcement blitz took place between 29-30 April 2021.

This operation focused on dealing with non-compliance with building regulations and protecting our country's revenue base by removing counterfeit goods and illegal immigrants. The operations also focused on dealing with infringement of municipal bylaws, enforcement of the Road Traffic act, and criminal activities.

KwaDukuza Mayor, Cllr. Lindile Nhaca joined the rest of the nation in applauding Lungelwa Mtetwa (21) who will be heading to China

after winning in the inter-continental leg of the Worldskills Africa Bricklaying Competition earlier this week at Swakopmund, Namibia. Mtetwa is a Civil Engineering & Construction student at Coastal TVET College who hails from Darnall, KwaDukuza, he is amongst the five South African gold medalists who were competing in the Worldskills Africa Competition 2022.

## KWADUKUZA MAYOR COMMITTS TO INTENSIFY ACTION AGAINST ILLEGAL DUMPING AND ENERGY LOSSES

KwaDukuza Mayor, Lindile Nhaca called on all stakeholders to work together in intensifying the fight against electricity theft and illegal dumping. "Working with various stakeholders, we will be launching the Programme for Change which seeks to intensify action against illegal dumping. This will be a multipronged strategy underpinned by five key pillars to drive a change agenda.

Due to electricity theft and activities alike, the municipality experiences energy loss of an average of R20 million per month. KwaDukuza Municipality purchases energy at an average of 55-Gigawatt hours (GWh) which costs an average of R70 million per month. It then sells at an average of 44GWh with the price of an average of R80 million per month. This means that energy losses are averaged at 11GWh costing an average of R20 million per month.

This initiative was held in partnership with the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development, Enterprise iLembe, Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs, and the Maphumulo Sub-tropical Fruit Growers Cooperative. The theme for the market day was "To exhibit our products, to promote job creation to youth, women empowerment and people living with disabilities."

Local entrepreneur Mr. Nene delivered a motivational message emphasizing the contribution of agriculture to the economy. "It is agriculture that will help us fight poverty alleviation, unemployment, and unstable economy. Let us promote the upscaling of Agriculture in particular Agro-processing and manufacturing of agricultural products. Let us also promote the exporting of agricultural products as well as to organise marketing the assistance of the Municipality."

Mayor, Cllr Siboniso Nyatikazi encouraged local farmers to work closely with the traditional leadership to promote agriculture stating that the vision is to make Maphumulo a liveable place where socio-economic well-being and quality of life are realised by 2035. He emphasised that agricultural development is important for the local municipality and that it should be appropriately implemented in Maphumulo. # MAYOR ASSESSES HOMES AFFECTED BY FLOODS

Following the recent disaster floods, Maphumulo Local Municipality Mayor Cllr Siboniso Nyatikazi and councillors conducted an oversight visit to families who were affected by the floods on Friday 29 April 2022 in Ward 10.

Assessment results showed that Maphumulo had 281 damaged homes where 60 people were left homeless and there was significant

damage to access roads and bridges. The Mayor urged community members affected by the floods to report to their ward councillors so that they can receive immediate interventions. "These floods have caused great economic and social damage, and we urge the Provincial and National government to swiftly assist in ensuring that our people receive urgent attention to recover." Said Mayor Nyatikazi.

The Mayor was accompanied by relief support assistance from Ink Foundation which was tasked by National Lotteries Commission as an implementing organization to support 200 severely affected households within Maphumulo. 200 food parcels, 200 blankets, 200 sponges, 200 five (5L) water, and 200 Dignity packs.

## IMPACT OF FLOODS ON NDWEDWE COMMUNITY

Like the rest of the province, Ndwedwe Municipality was affected by the floods that saw families being torn apart with no food, shelter, or clothing, and in some cases, casualties. Some of the hard-hit areas were Ndongolo, Galile, Meme, Ntaphuka, Wewe, Mona, and Mission. 13 deaths were reported and the municipality assisted with the burials and it continues to offer relief to the affected families. To date, the municipality has assisted 50 beneficiaries in wards 11 & 12 (Isibonelo Creche), 50 beneficiaries in wards 13 & 14 (Mavela Court), and 50 beneficiaries in wards 09 & 19 (Sgedleni), 50 beneficiaries at ward 03 & 07 (Umzamo Hall). The National Minister of Social Development

Ms. Lindiwe Zulu and MEC for Social Development Ms. Nonhlanhla Khoza also extended support to the distraught families with food parcels and blankets.

The Ogunjini bridge which connects Ndwedwe and Osindisweni collapsed during the heavy rains, the Mayor was accompanied by KZN Premier Sihle Zikalala with MEC for Transport and Community Safety Liaison Peggy Nkonyeni and other councillors. The extent of the damage is significant and the province will assist with the repairs.
